Data Breaches Affecting Wisconsin

If you have watched the news recently you have probably heard about the recent data breaches. In September, the large internet website host, Godaddy.com, reported that a malicious code allowed access to clients usernames, passwords and payment information. Also in September, Wilderness Resorts in Wisconsin Dells reported about 40,000 individuals who had used credit or debit cards at the resorts gaming arcades had their information compromised. In August, approximately 75,000 (past and current) students and staff at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee were affected by a computer hacker that had access to names as well as social security numbers.

What do hackers do with this information? The most common form of identity theft is credit card fraud. Thieves will open accounts in your name and you may not even know it until collectors start calling you. Other ways they use your personal information is by opening utilities or renting apartments in your name. It is also common for these thieves to target children as they have no credit and are perfect targets.

The best way to protect yourself is with knowledge. By being aware of what hackers and thieves are doing you can better prevent it from happening to you. Shred anything that has personal information on it and check your credit reports often.

FCRS Community Organization of the Month:



The Emergency Shelter of the Fox Valley (ESFV), now in its 30th year, operates four programs that provide services to both those who are homeless and those who are at-risk of becoming homeless. The Shelter Program provides safe, temporary shelter, meals and basic needs for individuals and families. The Services Program provides case management services to adults who are staying in shelter to help them achieve their individual goals. The Prevention Program, operated in collaboration with LEAVEN, provides financial assistance and case management support to individuals who are at-risk of becoming homeless. The Street Outreach program engages with individuals who are living in places unfit for human habitation and connects them with services. Last year, the Emergency Shelter served over 2,000 people in the community.

There are a number of ways that people can help the ESFV! Your financial support is always appreciated. They also rely heavily on in-kind donations. Currently, they are in need of: shampoo & conditioner, alarm clocks, baby monitors, adult cold and/or allergy OTC medication, laundry baskets, towels, baby wash, shampoo, lotion, men's & women's white socks, copy paper (white, letter size), ground beef, whole chickens, turkeys, hams, deli meat, fruit, granola bars, chips, peanut butter or 30 gallon garbage bags (leaf size).
